
The quiet seaside town of Guilford was my first stop to shop for Excursionz' debut. I dropped anchor by the beautiful Green on historic Whitfield Street. Many of the colonial style houses from the 17th century are still located near The Green today. The Reverend Henry Whitfield settled this community during the summer of 1639, and not much has changed over the centuries. Granite blocks used for the base of the Statue of Liberty came from local quarries. Guilford's Fritz-Greene Halleck, was acknowledged as America's first poet. A statue in Central Park, New York honors his achievement.

For me, the spirit of history is reflected in the shops that line Whitfield Street and the neighboring Water Street. Though a dollar won't get you as far as it would have in the 17th century, I found the prices well within range for the quality of the merchandise in these little treasure troves by the sea.

The displays of the sale items were where the deals were found. I believe in never paying full price for any product and where time allows, I wait for changes. What changes? I'm glad you asked. Store owners are always in flux with the seasons. Therefore, to make room for the next season's merchandise, the current season's are put on sale.

A big boost for the little guy was the quality of service from the employees. My experience in Guilford was fantastic. I was greeted with a smile and younger people who put forth an effort of appreciation. My questions were answered with no eye rolling or shrugging of shoulders. They seemed happy in their jobs and if you are one who likes being treated with respect, as I do, then these workers win hands down over the big guy establishments.




Let's begin on The Green where Brendan Loughlin's Whitfield Street Gallery showcases brilliant canvases depicting nature's splendor. 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


GuilFord's Guide to Shopping



The scrumptious sweets come locally from all over New England. Custom made baskets keep the store busy during the holidays. So if you have a chocolate lover on your holiday list, this is a wonderful way to sweeten up even the most finicky family member. They even have a selection of sugar free items to choose from, which, having brought my diabetic mother along for the shopping trip, gave her a little taste as well.



One store bridged the generation gap for shoppers. *Flutterby's* appeal to all ages was revealed in the variety of clothing, furniture, indulgent body and bath goods, pottery, and so much more. A large amount of the clothing is from New York and there is always something on sale. Another plus to shopping here for clothes; alterations are done on site. Fine details on the hand painted switch plates, drawer pulls, and cabinet knobs puts hardware in a completely new class of accessorizing. European influence is apparent in the stylish furniture, yet it suggests a "put your feet up" comfortable air. No shopping trip is complete without a visit to a bookstore.

Breakwater Books, though a small shop, has floor to ceiling books nestled in dozens of bookcases. For 35 years, they have been providing readers with non-fiction, reference, and children's books. Anything a large scaled bookstore offers, Breakwater has also, as they are well stocked, but can fill orders in a few days if needed. One difference I noticed immediately, in comparison to the larger bookstore chains, was the charming cozy atmosphere. I felt like I was stepping into a private library, where the world of fiction or poetry could wrap their stories gently around me.

There were several shops where window browsing got the better of me. I know how difficult it can be to shop with my children under foot, but on The Guilford Green, it is not a problem. Lasses and Lads Playspace has an offer you may want to take advantage of, "Drop & Shop." With prior arrangements, you can drop your children off in the care of their professionals and go shopping. My experience shopping in Guilford was fantastic. I took notice of the friendly help from the sales people, this impressed me. Perhaps it is the fresh sea air and quietness of the town that influences these young kids to have good manners and respectful attitudes. Now that warms a shopper's heart.

Don't forget there are many shopping spots along Route 1 (Boston Post Road). Guilford Tile where they boast "Let our showroom...show you!" Exclusively Children, has clothing, accessories and footwear for your special little ones. Guilford Sporting Goods is the local store to find what you need for anything that has to do with sports. One place that is a must see is Gozzi Turkey Farms; you will be amazed at the pastel-colored turkeys that roam the farm. I did find the colors made the turkeys more attractive, which left me curious; do you think they found each other more attractive too?

On Route 77, Dudley Farm, which has been in the same family for 350 years, is being preserved to exemplify the family history. They also run a Farmers Market on Saturdays from July through October. Another fantastic stop along Route 1 is Bishop's Orchard. Since 1872 the Bishop family has been growing and selling native fruits and vegetables. However, this farm offers so much more. Yearly "Pick Your Own" begins in July and runs through October. Visit the website at www.bishopsorchard.com for a complete schedule of what is in season for the pickin'. A market and bakery is open all year where you can buy the crops grown right there on the farm or pick up their homemade cider. Gift Giving Opportunity sums this orchard up nicely, with fruit baskets or custom-made veggie, cheese, and cookie platters. Visit the Bakery for the homemade muffins, breads, pies, cookies and more that are always "fresh from the oven." In the mood to add some spirits to the spirit of giving? Then the winery is the place to select from an assortment of flavors picked and processed right from their own orchards. A bottle of wine and a basket full of goodies fresh from the farm, what could be more charming?








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





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












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




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






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
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









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
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Who doesn't love a bargain? Or, buying that sweater or swimsuit for less? Do you need to redecorate the bath and know of just the right item? You are ready to shop, but how do you know you're getting the best bang for your buck? Well, I have gathered some tips that can help you save time and money.

Many stores have clearance items marked down at the end of a current season in order to make room for new seasonal inventory. Often beginning in August, summer merchandise 1-Timing Can be Key has to be cleared out for the fall fashions coming in - this means savings!

Sometimes unwritten policies allow patrons to receive sale prices the day before or on 2- Check the Store Policies the day after a sale begins and ends. Ask, and you may be extended this courtesy.

Quite often huge savings can be had if you consider purchasing the floor displays, like kitchen appliances, rather than new merchandise. Many of these products have only minor **3- Dented and Scratched Displays** scratches or "demishes," but can offer considerable cash savings.

Why pay full price for big purchases, like furniture? Find a sales person who works on commission and negotiate you may be able to strike a discount of 10% or more. **4-Everything is Negotiable** Those who work on salary aren't going to be as motivated as the commissioned sales person to "make that sale."

Stay in touch with your favorite stores. You will receive mailings that will let you know what is going on sale and when. You'll also get coupons and even "sneak previews" of what's to come. 5-Sign up for Mailing Lists

6-Before Making that Purchase

Many stores will tell you, but sometimes you have to ask, if the item will be going on sale soon. It could be worth the wait.

7- Ask for Reimbursement During Sales

You bought a pair of jeans at full price last week, now they are on sale this week. Not a problem if you ask for the difference in prices. Many stores will do this provided it is within a certain period and you have the receipt.

8- Weekend Sales

Many targe retailers begin setting up for the sale on Thursdays. To avoid the crowds, shop then. Let the store know that you wish to take advantage of the sale price now, instead of coming back over the weekend.

9- Make a List

If you are on a budget, making a list and sticking to it will save you plenty.

10- Do I Really Need This?


A great question to ask yourself before checking out. If you don't need it or really don't want it, don't buy it.


